

Congressman Hanna to travel with President Obama to Schenectady

WASHINGTON, D.C. – U.S. Representative Richard Hanna (R,C,I-NY) will be aboard Air Force One with President Barack Obama on Friday for a visit to Schenectady, N.Y.

President Obama invited Hanna to travel with him to Upstate New York for his remarks at the General Electric plant in Schenectady. President Obama “will make remarks on the importance of growing the economy and making America more competitive by investing in jobs, innovation and clean energy,” according to information released by the White House.

Congressman Hanna will be seated in the audience at GE Energy for the President’s remarks.
