

NFIB recognizes Hanna for his support of jobs issues in Congress

WASHINGTON, D.C. – **U.S. Rep. Richard Hanna** (NY-24) today was presented with the National Federation of Independent Businesses (NFIB) Guardian of Small Business Award.

Hanna accepted the



award today at the U.S. Capitol from NFIB President and CEO Dan Danner. Hanna received a perfect score for the votes he cast during the 112th Congress based on NFIB's key votes scorecard, demonstrating a commitment to protecting free enterprise.
