

I voted Yes on the Senate Amendment to H.R. 886, the United States Marshals Service 225th Anniversary Commemorative Coin Act.

The bill would authorize the striking and sale of commemorative coins in honor of the 225th anniversary of the United States Marshals Service. Specifically it calls for a gold coin, silver coin, and half dollar clad coin to be sold at face value plus and the cost of designing and distributing the coins with an added surcharge. The proceeds from the surcharges will be directed to fund the United States Marshals Museum, the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association Foundation, and other causes.

The Senate amended H.R. 886 to require that minting and issuing these coins will not result in any net cost to the federal government and further clarifies that no proceeds shall be disbursed until the United States Treasury has recovered the full cost of implementing this act.

I support this legislation to commemorate the 225th Anniversary of the nation's oldest federal law enforcement agency and the fiscally-responsible Senate amendment.

The bill was approved by a vote of 409 – 2 – 2.
